Local hotshot designer Bruno Braën is a regular at the cosy, stripped-back wine bar he has created in an otherwise quiet part of Downtown. The huge wine-glass chandelier is a fitting centrepiece to a bar with friendly, knowledgeable sommeliers, who serve more than 120 varietals by the glass from a staggeringly extensive cellar. Go for a selection of three tasting glasses, which are matched and sequenced by the

house to maximise their impact on your taste buds. The modern tapas selection is not to be sniffed at, but the wine's the thing here. If you're in a group, head for the mezzanine floor – a splendid space to start off an evening.
